Working with sustainable and recycled materials

We routinely include some sustainable and recycled building materials in the construction of our homes.

This may include installing window frames made from recycled uPVC and using recycled aggregates and blocks made from mineral ash.

Much of the insulation we use is made from recycled bottles too.

We have a policy for all our timber to come from sustainably managed forests, with FSC or PEFC certification.

We also work with suppliers who share our values. One of our kitchen suppliers offers kitchen cabinets made with recycled chipboard.
